

First Stop Six Mile Water

Seven days to explore the fabulous north east corner of Northern Ireland. The Campsite is owned by the Antrim and Newtownabbey Council. It has spacious hard standing pitches and is within easy walking distance of Antrim town along the river and through the castle grounds. The campsite is on the shore of the largest lake in Ireland Loch Neagh where you can cruise around the shore. Belfast with the Titanic Experience and Ulster Transport and Folk Museum which is a lot better than the name would suggest. Drive out to Larne and along the breathtaking coast road to Giants Causeway and the Bushmills Distillery. Visit the Joey Dunlop Memorial garden on your way back. Second Stop Rushin House

This an immaculate privately own site overlooking the shores of Lough MacNea with spectacular panoramic views in all directions. It is 1 mile from the picturesque village of Belcoo, 13 miles from Enniskillen and 25 miles from Sligo. The park, which is located on a family farm, provides high-quality facilities in a tranquil lakeside setting and has been accredited 5-star classification by the Northern Ireland Tourist Board.
